Each week we gather in community for a time of worship. The worship service is designed to flow from one part to another and follows a theme. For many pastors, they follow what is called "The Common Lectionary" which is a combination of assigned scriptures developed by the Catholic and Protestant churches.

Prelude: This is a time of preparation for worship. The music is

selected to help the worshipper begin focusing and preparing

their hearts and minds for worship.

Welcome: This is a time of recognition of the gathering of our church

family and the welcoming of guests.

Announcements: This is a time to share the activities of the

congregation.

Opening hymn: This hymn is chosen based upon the scriptures and

theme of the day.

Liturgy: The Moravian Church is a liturgical church in that the liturgy

for the day is a part of the service where the congregation prays in one voice. Our liturgies are basically scripture brought together to surround a specific theme, i.e. Grace,

Adoration, Covenanting, etc.

Prayers of the People: This is an opportunity to pray for ministries and

members within the congregation and situations on the

national and world scene.

Scripture: Normally the assigned lessons from The Common Lectionary

are used as the main subject for the worship theme.

Children's Moment: A time for the children to gather in the front for

moment of reflection on the scripture lesson(s) of the day.

Presentation of Tithes and Offerings: This is when we respond to God's

grace and present our collective contributions.

The Offering Plate is located on the stand as you enter the sanctuary.

Message: This is a teaching time based upon the scripture(s) of the day to go deeper into the theme

of the service.

Prayer: To bring to conclusion the message, asking God's presence in some special way as we

prepare to return to our life in the world.

Hymn: This is a reflection of the theme for the day and the message. Its purpose is to support

the message and how it impacts us going forward.

Benediction: The blessing of those present as they depart.

Silent Meditation: Reflecting on all the service

Postlude: The conclusion of the service. Frequently this is an upbeat composition intended to lift

our spirits as we go back to our ministry in the world. Sometimes it may be soft and thoughtful as we continue our reflection on the scriptures, service and the message.

Lessons from Camp

Camping season has come to a close for the year. What lessons from camp will we carry with us into the fall? Anyone who has been part of a church camp will know there are certain parts of the experience that can't be replicated anywhere else. But there are important lessons we learn at camp that we can, and should, keep in mind all year long.

Campers come from different backgrounds, towns, congregations, and families to form a **community**. For a week or so we eat, sleep, learn, work, worship, pray, and play together. Details of our everyday lives that would normally separate us fade into the background. As we spend time with each other we learn to see God's love reflected in the faces of those around us, and even in ourselves.

At camp we immerse ourselves in opportunities to strengthen our **faith**. A daily dose of scripture, prayer, and worship can be transformational. Hearing about others' faith journey and sharing our own stories helps us to ask the kind of questions that lead to growth. Our faith is not just a private matter, but something that grows stronger when shared in community.

None of us are perfect and spending so much time together can also lead to conflict. In a Christian community, we remind each other of the grace God offers us and encourage each other to extend that grace to everyone around us. We seek reconciliation and let go of grudges. **Forgiveness** leads to even deeper relationships.

With so many unique individuals coming together, it's easy to see how all of our **gifts** work together. Some of us are called to share talents we already know about, but camp also offers a chance to discover new ways we can bless each other through leadership, service, and simply sharing our perspective. Many campers discover God's purpose for their lives at camp.

One of the most cherished lessons from camp is the value of true **friendship**. Many lifelong friendships (and even marriages!) begin at church camp. Bonds are created and strengthened each year that extend far beyond that one summer week.

- We may not be able to continue the camp experience this fall, but these important lessons don't have to end with the summer. Throughout this newsletter are ways for you to continue to learn and grow alongside your church family. I hope you'll consider how you will help build community, strengthen your faith, foster forgiveness, discover and use your unique gifts, and deepen friendships here at Dover First. Those are the timeless lessons from camp that stay with us all year long.



Our faith-based book club returns this fall. We will meet one Saturday morning each month at **Missions Café** at **8:00 a.m.** Check out our fall selections:




September 20: The Stranger in the Lifeboat (Mitch Albom)
