

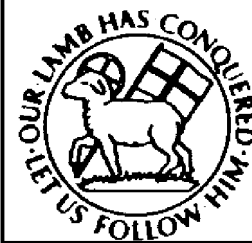

Music Department News 2026

Normally.....Usually.....We've always.....Not this Summer!

As a director of music.....normally.....Summer becomes a season of change from the regular schedule to perhaps a more laid-back approach to the schedule. This was the time....usually.... projects and performances were less of an endeavor. Just the regular planning of services and the like....we've always.....done it that way. Not this year!!!!!!

The Reeves Memorial Organ was scheduled for a much-needed electrical update caused somewhat by age but significantly impacted by electrical surges over a period of many years. The console was “surgically” removed from the loft on a hydraulic lift during several nail-biting moments at the end of June. It traveled to the Muller Organ Factory for a total electrical digital rebuild. The chambers were stripped of the rack of computer boards and other wiring. After the factory work was completed, the organ console returned and was rehoisted into the loft. The tenuous job of reconnecting every circuit and installation of the new digital operating system began. On August 6, the bulk of the work was completed and the fine tuning began. This large project was funded by an \$87,500 grant from the Reeves Foundation which has given continuous care to the instrument since 1915. We thank them for their continued care and generosity.

The Reeves Bell Choir was selected to open the 2026 Ohio Choral Connections on July 8th on the campus of Legacy Christian School, Sugarcreek, Ohio. This event was a full weekend of seven choral concerts and select workshops. Reeves opened and performed on Friday evening followed by the terrific Oasis Chorale. It was a great evening and the singing was heavenly. However, of the 350 people in attendance, 90% were totally unfamiliar with handbells. They were amazed with the performance of our handbell choir and it dominated many conversations among the Mennonites. For Reeves, it was preceded by several weeks of weekly rehearsals, moving bells, performing the concert, returning the equipment and re-setting the rehearsal room. I am continually thankful for the dedication of this group and their constant striving for excellence.

It should not go unnoticed that our summer music has been provided by our members of the music department and congregation. The intent was for the congregation to see the wealth of musicians the Lord has given to this church. I hope the music spoke to your heart and you speak a word of appreciation to them for their offering to the worship service. Thank you to all our summer musicians.

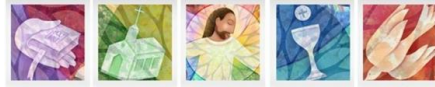

Let's take another look at the August 30 Daily Text: *"Watchword for the week – Jesus said, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.' Matthew 16:24."*

This is a familiar verse to many of us. What does it mean to you? How does it make you feel? Burdened, weighed down, struggling to keep going? When we think of Jesus carrying his cross it's no wonder we feel that way. But in this verse Jesus isn't asking us to carry *his* cross. He is asking us to carry *our own* cross – a cross that is unique to us – a cross designed to use our own special spiritual gifts. Carrying it requires effort and dedication. But carrying it also brings purpose and joy.

What cross are you carrying right now? Is it lifting you up as you serve God and serve others? Or is it a cross not meant for you, weighing you down? In this season of change, I invite you to pray and consider if your cross is changing as well. God has called a new pastor and family to our congregation, a new season of cooler nights and colorful leaves is on its way, a new Sunday school year is beginning. What cross is Jesus asking you to carry right now? Is it time to set down an old burden and pick up a new ministry? You have a spiritual gift, maybe more than one. 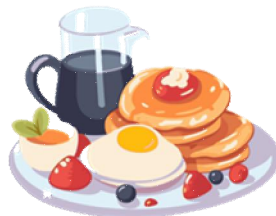

Our faith-based Book Club returns this fall. We will meet **one Saturday morning each month at Missions Café at 8:00 a.m.** Check out our fall selections:

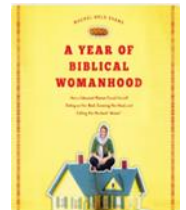


September 19: The First Phone Call from Heaven (Mitch Albom)

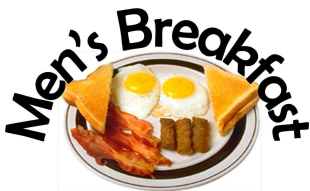

The duties of the Board of Trustees include overseeing the planning, development and maintenance of church properties. The trustees plan the budget of annual expenses associated with supporting the work of the congregation. 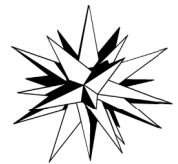
