# Did you know?

#### THE POINSETTIA

In the early part of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, an American, Dr. Joel Roberts Poinsett, was serving as an ambassador in Mexico. While there he admired a beautiful red flower that grew roof top high and bloomed at Christmas. The Mexican Christians told him that the flower was part of their celebration of the birth and life of Christ.

This is the story they told him. "The Bethlehem star shone over the manger where Jesus was born. Its light was so bright that the earth responded by receiving that star light, reflecting that star light, and mirroring that star light with a beautiful flower. That flower was star shaped, pure white with golden star centers. It grew on earth as a creation to glorify and commemorate that Holy Night. Then came the tragic day when Jesus died on the cross and the blossoms changed. Pure white petals remembered the sacrifice of the Christ born when the star was over Bethlehem. The blossoms then changed from white to blood red." In Mexico this flower is called "Flower of the Holy Night."


