

Our Christian Education Opportunities

from the Board of World Mission

In 2023, the Board of World Mission's Blessings Flow Project provided clean water to over 400 families in the La Moskitia region of Honduras, through the distribution of household water filters. As the year came to a close, Moravian congregations and individuals went above and beyond to make the blessings overflow. Our goal was to provide five La Moskitia villages with clean water for over a decade, but your generosity blew that goal out of the water! The project is far from over, but at this point, we have raised over \$150,000 to share the blessing of safe, clean drinking water. **Thanks be to God!**

Filtration systems will be provided to over 2,500 households. We are moving toward clean water flowing for at least a decade in every home in 10+ communities. Most importantly, health and hope will be restored in an area where 100% of families experience symptoms of waterborne illness in any given two-week period.

Sisters and brothers, our church family contributed **over \$7,098.02** to this project alone.
