

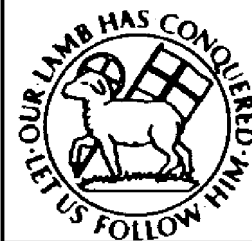

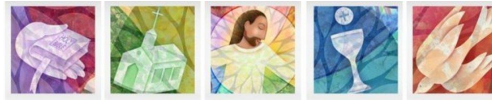

NEW EVERY MORNING

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end, they are new every morning."
Lamentations 3:22,23

How about a NEW devotion for the NEW year? The tradition of the printed Moravian Daily Texts dates back almost 200 years, but still in 2026 it offers a daily message from God that's NEW every morning.

If you ordered a copy for 2026, check out "How to Use the Daily Texts" in the front of your book. If you'd like to order a copy now, I am happy to help you. You can sign up for a daily "One Call Now" phone call if you prefer to listen. Follow the "Moravian Daily Texts" Facebook page where they are posted every morning. Or look them up on moravian.org where you can also sign up to have them emailed to you each day.

These wonderful daily devotions enjoyed by people around the world (and not just Moravians) come with something extra: a Bible reading plan – something from the Psalms, the Old Testament, and the New Testament each day. If you follow it, you will read all the Psalms in one year and the rest of the Bible in two years. 2026 is the beginning of a NEW two-year cycle, so it's a great time to join in!

A few more devotions I recommend . . .

For Kids: The Hands-On Bible "Weekly Bible Reading Plan" for families. Look it up online or I can print you a copy. This one will guide you through 52 important scripture passages in a year. For the youngest children, look up the corresponding verses in a children's story Bible, or read the scripture first and then tell them the story.

For Teens: d365. Download the app or go to d365.org. This one has a weekly theme and a song to listen to as you pause, listen, think, pray & go. Great if you only have 5-10 minutes. (I can confirm this one is excellent for adults, too!)

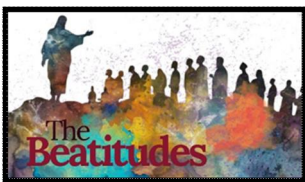
For Parents: Unbridled Prayers. Download the app and let it guide you in prayer for your child(ren) and family. Choose from early childhood, elementary, or preteen.

For Adults: If you liked the "ABC's of Christmas" check out "A Is for Alabaster: 52 Reflections on the Stories of Scripture." Anna Carter Florence brings people and stories from the Bible to NEW life with one entry for each week of the year.

I can't wait to hear what NEW devotions you try in the NEW year!

Note: There will be no Zoom on Tuesday, January 20.

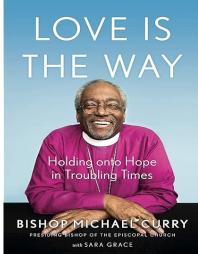
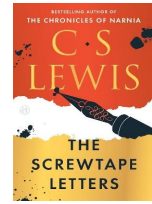
