Did you know?

THE NATIVITY

The first nativity scene originated in Italy in 1223 when St. Francis of Assisi asked a villager to create a live scene depicting the event of the Holy Birth. This was used to help people understand the Christmas story in its simple beauty. St. Francis performed the Christmas mass in front of this "live" nativity.

Out of that experience grew the practice of carving various nativity pieces to create the nativity scene. Nativity scenes were first used in churches in the 17th century.

A unique Moravian custom is the building of "putz," (which means to decorate) and consists of various "scenes" surrounding the birth of Christ. Moravians brought this custom to America and built putzes in their homes. Children were taught to recite the Christmas story as the putz was shown. The sole purpose of the Moravian Christmas putz is to tell the story of the first Christmas.

When setting up a putz, Christ must always be in the center – the place he longs to occupy in our lives. And whenever we place a light in a nativity scene, the light should always be placed behind the Christ child, symbolizing that the light always comes FROM Christ.

THE TREE LIGHTS

The symbol of light is central in the Christian message that "Jesus is the Light of the World." As Isaiah 9:2 promises: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined."

It is told that one Christmas Eve, Martin Luther was outside looking at the heavens and became very moved by the beauty of the starry sky. Its brilliance and loveliness led him to reflect on the glory of the first Christmas Eve as seen in Bethlehem's radiant skies. He wanted to share the beauty of the starry sky with his wife and children, so he cut an evergreen from the forest, took it home and placed candles on it to represent the glorious starry heavens he had seen.

Advent is a time to remember that Jesus brought this powerful light into the world, and no amount of fear, or darkness, or misery can put that light out. Sometimes the light of Jesus is most evident in difficult times, just as the stars can only be seen in the dark of night.

A lighted star is often placed on top of Christmas trees, causing us to "look up" and see the star-light that led the wise men to the true light of the world – the Christ.

\$ Financial Giving \$

As we approach another year end, the Trustees would like to remind the congregation of some tips around church finances.

We are blessed to be able to support so many missions and projects in the life of our congregation and beyond. Some of these require separate bank accounts and reporting. Any support for **Sole Purpose, Memorial Fund, Music Memorial Fund, Helping Hand and Minister's Aid Society** should be given in a separate check if at all possible. Checks can be made out to "First Moravian Church" with the fund noted in the Memo line of the check. This allows more streamlined processing for the Trustees and Cooper Accounting.

We do want to report that envelope giving for 2025 as of October is currently 12% less versus 2024 envelope giving during the same period. While we are meeting our obligations, operational expenses continue to rise and we will soon be looking at the 2026 operational budget. We expect to have discussions around budget cuts that will be required. We ask that you prayerfully consider whether you can provide additional financial assistance.

The Trustees would also like to remind you of the opportunities for electronic giving. This not only ensures stability for the church finances, but it reduces costs and time required in preparing financial records. We partner with Vanco for a safe and reliable service for electronic church giving.


