The Holy Days Ahead

We celebrated Holy Week and Easter on April 20, with all its liturgical wonders and extra services. It began with the hosanas of Palm Sunday with Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Then we gathered Monday through Friday for accounts of Jesus' last week on earth. We remembered the Last Supper through our Maundy Thursday Holy Communion service.

Our congregation's Easter Sunday began with a gathering of Tuscarawas Moravian churches at the Schoenbrunn Village Cemetery to share the Easter Morning Liturgy. Later we gathered in the sanctuary and prayed the Easter Liturgy, heard about the empty tomb and the appearance of the risen Lord, and ended by singing the hallelujahs to praise the Lord.

All that is behind us, so what lies ahead. What is next on our journey through the Church year. The liturgical color for Easter is white, therefore, the pulpit and holy communion table will be adorned with the white paraments. The next leg of our journey will be Ascension Sunday when we celebrate Christ's ascension into heaven. This is a celebration which has sort of fallen by the wayside but is extremely important theologically. Jesus MUST ascend into heaven in order to complete his

resurrection. This is different than Lazarus being raised from the dead because Lazarus will die again. But for Jesus to give us eternal life, he must ascend into heaven and send the Holy Spirit. Ascension Sunday is June 1, and a week later we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Day of **Pentecost**.



This is a celebration where God's Holy Spirit comes to dwell on earth and enable us to share the good news of the resurrection of Jesus. We honor this Sunday with **Holy Communion** during worship on **June 8**.

But we're not finished yet. On June 15, we celebrate the Trinity when we remember the three representations of the full Godhead. It's a time we recognize the presence of the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. We'll take a close look at the Trinity on Sunday, June 15. All this is followed by the Season of Pentecost which will lead us to the Season of Advent.

Please consider making this journey with us. You are invited to join us each Sunday at 10 a.m. in the sanctuary. May you be enriched as we continue our journey of faith going forward.

Come help us paint rocks with uplifting messages. We will "plant" them around town and anywhere our summer travels take us.



Annual Chalk Walk by Steve Rondinella, Elder Vice-Chair Tuesday, May 6, at 9:00 a.m. First Moravian



Requests for funds and purchases from the staff, congregational ministries, and external groups are reviewed. Reports from the Treasurer and Financial Secretary are monitored monthly to gage progress towards meeting all obligations.
